#### Kindergarten Schedule

Rescue Elementary offers a full day Kindergarten program. In order to do so smoothly, we will be starting with a ramp-up half day schedule for 6 weeks. This will begin at 8:55 a.m.-12:55 p.m. from August 10<sup>th</sup> – September 16<sup>th</sup>. #### **Drop Off/Pick Up Procedures**


Drop Off Procedures: The drop off areas are located in front of the school office. When entering the drop off area, pull forward. Please do not leave your car unattended unless you are in a parking spot. Please do not drop off your students before 8:40 a.m.

Pick Up Procedures:

Please make sure you follow the following procedures when picking up your child after school:

- If you are walking on campus, please wait by the covered picnic table area. Please do not wait outside of your child's classroom. Your child's teacher will walk their class out.
- Kindergarten families will pick up their children outside of the Kindergarten Playground next to the Rescue West gravel parking area. Please hold a sign with your child's name on it.
- If you are picking your child up in front of the office, please pull forward to the end of the curb to help the flow of traffic. *Please have a sheet of paper with your student(s) name in the visor*. This will help us expedite the flow of traffic. Please do not leave your vehicle unattended at the curb.
- All students need to be picked up by 3:20 p.m. on regular days and by 2:20 p.m. on Early Release days. We are not able to supervise students after that period of time.
- If you choose to park and meet your student, please use the appropriate entrance and park in the appropriate spaces. Please do not park in handicap spaces unless you have a placard.
- Those wishing to use our Rescue West overflow parking, please use the entrance at the west end of the parking lot to enter. We will be closing the bar gate near the Kindergarten building for the safety of students and parents. Thank you for your help with this.

#### **Rescue Parent Teacher Club**



#### Art and Music

"MAKE YOUR MARK, AND SEE WHERE IT TAKES YOU!!" That is the lesson schools have been exploring for more than 10 years on International Dot Day which is celebrated on September 15. Based on the lesson in The Dot a book by Peter H. Reynolds, Dot Day encourages students to be courageous and curious in their artistic endeavors. Rescue Elementary Students will be making their own unique dots to contribute to a community art project in the art room, one of at least three community projects this year. As the artist Kandinsky, used dots to explore the relationship between music, color and emotion, our older students will also look at his



work for inspiration. Parents, families, and staff should feel free to design their own dot to add to our collage. Simply decorate a circle of any size that would fit on a sheet of 8x11 paper and bring it to the school office to participate. Many read-aloud videos of the book are available online. Check it out!
