Principal's Message

Hello Rescue Families, I hope you had a chance to have some quality family time over the break. Spring break is a unique time to make long lasting memories far away or in our own backyard. Either way, it was a nice break to refocus and get ready for the last eight weeks of school.

You are going to see some big changes on our campus when we get back from break. There will be a fence around the majority of our multipurpose room. We are beginning a remodel that will include some much needed improvements to our multipurpose room. The multipurpose room remodel will include new floors, an indoor stage, new restrooms, new kitchen, and a new outdoor eating area. This will allow for an improved functionality of our multipurpose room and a fresh look to our campus. Students will continue to use the multipurpose room for the remainder of this school year. The crew will begin work on the exterior of the building until school is out. I will give continual updates throughout the year on the progress of the remodel. The project should be completed in February 2025.

Our Character Trait for the month of April is a focus on Perseverance. Perseverance is a crucial character trait that plays a significant role in our student's academic journey. Perseverance involves determination and resilience needed to overcome challenges and obstacles encountered in school. Students who show perseverance are not easily discouraged by setbacks or failures but instead use them as opportunities to learn and grow. Our 3rd – 5th grade students will begin practicing for the Smarter Balanced Assessment which is scheduled to be given between April 22nd-May 3rd. This test is the normal assessment given by the state of California to measure how well students meet their grade level standards. Students will be tested in language arts, math, 5th Grade will take a science assessment. During this month, our students will become familiar with the online format/platform and will practice within their classes. As they do so, classes will focus on not just getting the right answer, but also being able to explain their thinking so they can make claims and then support them with evidence and details. Drop Off/Pick Up Procedures

Drop Off Procedures: The drop off areas are located in front of the school office. When entering the drop off area, pull forward. Please do not leave your car unattended unless you are in a parking spot. Pleased do not drop off your students before 8:40a.m

Pick Up Procedures:

- 1.Grade level families wanting to pick up their children on campus may wait either near the Rescue West parking lot or on the lower blacktop near the Library/Picnic table area. Please do not wait outside of your child's classroom. Your child's teacher will walk their class out. Please do not walk onto the blacktop or playground area until the dismissal bell rings.
- 2.Please do not park in handicap spaces unless you have a placard.
- 3.Please also leave the EDCOE parking spaces empty in the kindergarten parking lot. We have 3 to 4 vans that park in those spots daily to pick up students.

- **Fever:** If your child has a fever they are required to stay home until they are fever free for at least 24 hours without fever reducing medication (Tylenol, Motrin, etc).
- **Vomiting and/or Diarrhea:** Please keep your student home until they have at least one full day of normal health (no vomiting and/or diarrhea).



• For Colds and Flu's: If your child must be fever free for at least 24 hours (without fever reducing medications) and the cold/flu symptoms must be resolved or improving to return to school.
