Drop Off/Pick Up Procedures

Garden

Drop Off Procedures: The drop off areas are located in front of the school office. When entering the drop off area, pull forward. Please do not leave your car unattended unless you are in a parking spot. Pleased do not drop off your students before 8:40a.m

Pick Up Procedures:

1.Grade level families wanting to pick up their children on campus may wait either near the Rescue West parking lot or on the lower blacktop near the Library/Picnic table area. Please do not wait outside of your child's classroom. Your child's teacher will walk their class out. *Please do not walk onto the blacktop or playground area until the dismissal bell rings.*

2.Please do not park in handicap spaces unless you have a placard.

3.Please also leave the EDCOE parking spaces empty in the kindergarten parking lot. We have 3 to 4 vans that park in those spots daily to pick up students.

Thank you for your support in keeping your children safe. Please contact Mr. McGinnis if you have any questions. The garden lesson for March is about compost and worms. We will look at how compost is made and what ingredients are required. We will also talk about how worms can help in the creation of soil and break down of matter in the compost pile. We will also learn about worm lifecycles.





- **Fever:** If your child has a fever they are required to stay home until they are fever free for at least 24 hours without fever reducing medication (Tylenol, Motrin, etc).
- Vomiting and/or Diarrhea: Please keep your student home until they have at least one full day of normal health (no vomiting and/or diarrhea).



• For Colds and Flu's: If your child must be fever free for at least 24 hours (without fever reducing medications) and the cold/flu symptoms must be resolved or improving to return to school.

Music
