Hello Rescue Families,

At the end of the C building, you will notice 2 new drinking fountains and a water bottle filling station. With the increase of reusable water bottles on campus, this is a welcomed addition. The water filling station cools and filters the water that runs through it. You can even see a digital water bottle counter that shows how many uses it has had. The other project on campus is the completion of the new kindergarten shed. The shed was purchased by donations made by our Rescue Families during our various fundraisers. Our 3rd – 5th grade students will begin practicing for the Smarter Balanced Assessment which is scheduled to be given between April 24th-May 5th. This test is the normal assessment given by the state of California to measure how well students meet their grade level standards. Students will be tested in Language Arts and Math. During this month, our students will become familiar with the online format/platform and will practice within their classes. As they do so, classes will focus on not just getting the right answer, but also being able to explain their thinking so they can make claims and then support them with evidence and details. 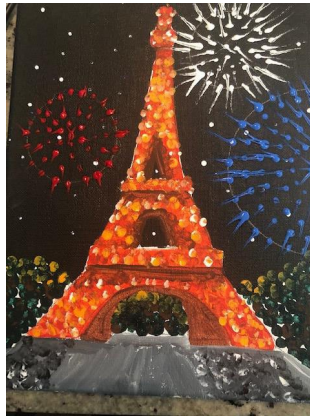
What's Cooking?

Drop Off/Pick Up Procedures

Drop Off Procedures: The drop off areas are located in front of the school office. When entering the drop off area, pull forward. Please do not leave your car unattended unless you are in a parking spot. Please do not drop off your students before 8:40 a.m.

Pick Up Procedures:

Please make sure you follow the following procedures when picking up your child after school:

- If you are walking on campus, please wait by the covered picnic table area. Please do not wait outside of your child's classroom. Your child's teacher will walk their class out.
- Kindergarten families will pick up their children outside of the Kindergarten Playground next to the Rescue West gravel parking area. Please hold a sign with your child's name on it.
- If you are picking your child up in front of the office, please pull forward to the end of the curb to help the flow of traffic. **Please have a sheet of paper with your student(s) name in the visor.** This will help us expedite the flow of traffic. Please do not leave your vehicle unattended at the curb.
- All students need to be picked up by 3:20 p.m. on regular days and by 2:20 p.m. on Early Release days. We are not able to supervise students after that period of time.
- If you choose to park and meet your student, please use the appropriate entrance and park in the appropriate spaces. Please do not park in handicap spaces unless you have a placard.
- Those wishing to use our Rescue West overflow parking, please use the entrance at the west end of the parking lot to enter. We will be closing the bar gate near the Kindergarten building for the safety of students and parents. Thank you for your help with this.
